Camporee – remain split for 2010  
Activities & Civic Service – create (new committee)  
Membership – combine  
Finance – combine (new committee structure)

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### \*\*Centennial District Structure

I have been given time at the University of Scouting to hold a class entitled: "The Ideal District Structure and Function - the national model as seen through Ore-Ida eyes".
